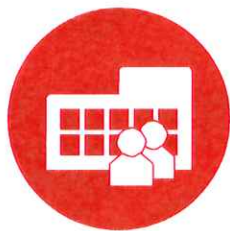

The Five Element Framework

Market relevant skills: The program will teach skills that reflect the needs of the local industry and community.

Effective Curriculum: The program will align with the requirements of today's employers, including technical, computer, literacy and soft skills.

Qualified Teachers: The TEC Program Teacher's/Trainer's are knowledgeable and well-equipped to deliver the curriculum to students.

Career Guidance: The program will provide guidance for career selection and equip students with knowledge and information about the pathways that exist within the automotive, engineering and mining industries.

Workplace Learning: The program will provide students for hands-on experience at each of the industry partners workplaces in addition to classroom and workshop practical experience.

How long is the program?

TEC at YMCA is a 2 year program for senior students who are preparing for a career as an apprentice or trainee in the automotive, engineering or mining industry.

What are Soft Skills?

They can be defined as a set of non-technical, professional abilities such as communication, interpersonal and customer service skills, as well as personal traits such as integrity and responsibility that employees need to secure employment and succeed in the workplace. Soft Skills is a 30 unit program which will provide student's with the Life Skills that are a critical missing link for employers and young job seekers.



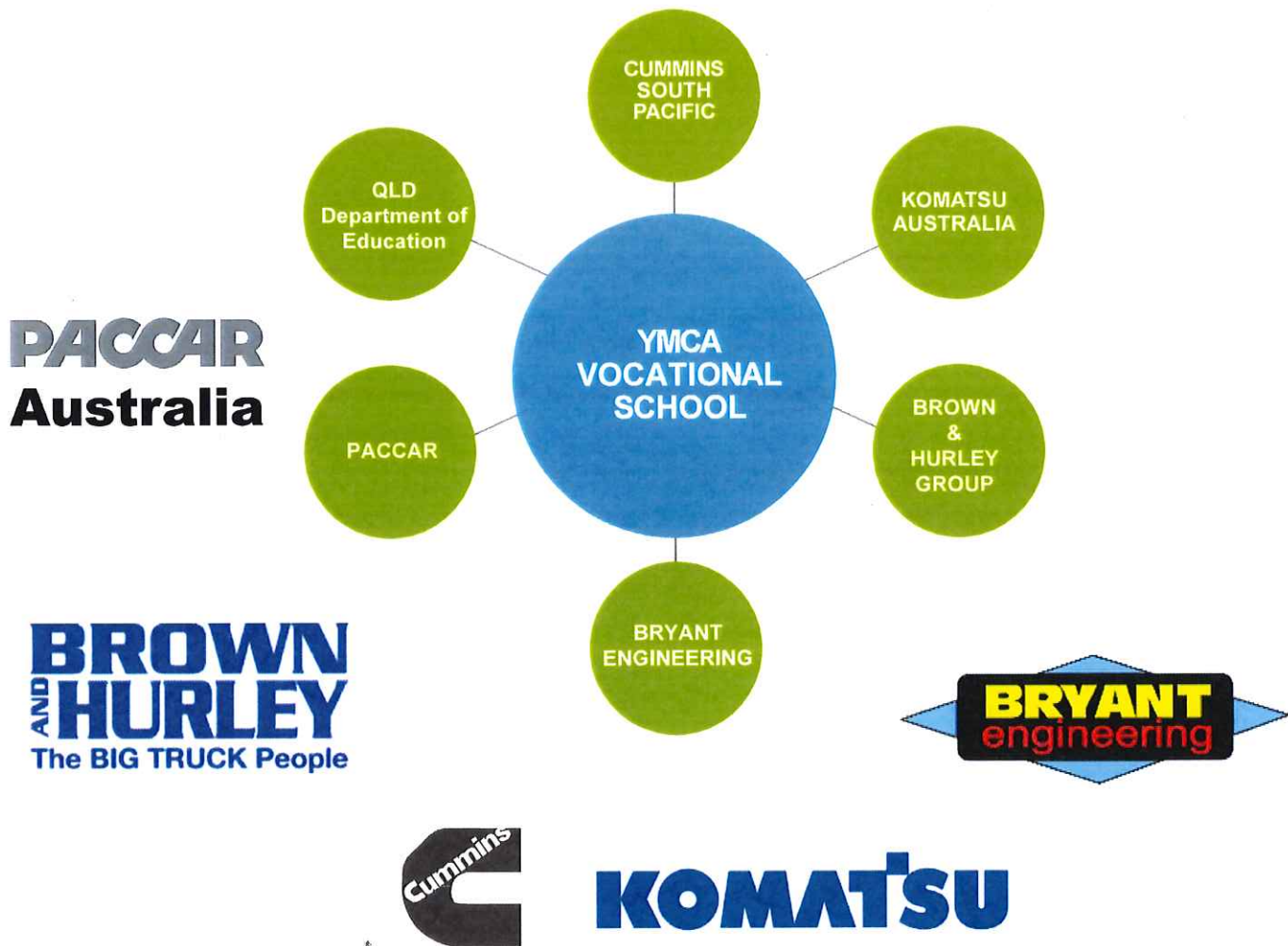
